Winter Weather Update

The winter season is upon us, and when the forecast turns cold or snowy, we understand that you want to know how your child's school will be impacted as soon as possible. Here are a few tips you can keep

in mind during this season of inclement weather:

- Outdoor Play: Our students play outside for recess and Panther Time in the winter, temperatures/wind chill permitting. We use the National Weather Advisory to guide us in those decisions. Please ensure that your student is dressed for the weather, including snowy days. Each day we will decide before recess and Panther Time if it is appropriate for our students to go outside.
- <u>Two-Hour Delay</u>: If the weather causes us to call for a Two-Hour Delay, school will start at 10:30 am. Your student should expect their transportation to come precisely 2 hours after normal pickup time.
- Inclement Weather Virtual Learning Day s: If an inclement weather day is scheduled, we will send Chromebooks home the day before so students can continue their learning from home when weather conditions make it unsafe to attend school in person.
- <u>Early Dismissal or School Closings Decisions</u> Notification will be made through email and our One Call System.


ELA Showcase Shout Out
