





Spring continues to be busy in the WORC room!

Our younger elementary students worked on improving their fine motor skills by stenciling bookmarks and creating paper chains to

decorate during Educator Appreciation Week. Their lessons focused on positive self-talk, understanding one's strengths, and the importance of behaving in expected ways.

Our middle and high school students continued supporting our educators by creating Ellison letters and assisting with copying materials. They also did a

phenomenal job delivering items all around campus. The students were polite, responsible, and kind to those they interacted with. The lessons focused on strategies to improve attention, following interests in possible careers, and skill building as they look to transition to the next grade in school.

Our monthly social-emotional learning (SEL) lesson focused on understanding and appreciating diversity in our society. Here's what you can do at home to help your student develop these skills:

- Model using positive self-talk, especially in difficult situations.
- Talk to your child about their strengths and help them to focus on things that they are good at.
- Be consistent with setting expectations at home and following through.
- Encourage and support your child's educational journey.
- Model tolerance and appreciation for diversity

Extended School Year (ESY) is a wonderful opportunity for students to work on their academic, social, and emotional skills. Rising 9th and 10th graders will have a chance to participate in a Spanish language course. They will also be provided the opportunity to participate in a workstudy course. All of our students will be able to

Our older students participated in two great experiences this month- Enoch the Poet and Carlos Bradley!

Carlos Bradley, a retired professional football player, played for the San Diego Chargers and The Philadelphia Eagles. He owns a fitness consulting firm and has worked with NBA and NFL players. Mr. Bradley is the executive vice president of ISAA, International Student Athlete Academy, a non-profit organization helping student athletes both





academically and athletically. Mr. Bradley shared how his motivation came from his mom, who reminded him that he could do anything he put his mind to. He explained that sports were always important to him, but he knew it could not be his only focus. Mr. Bradley made sure to go to college, earn a degree, and put it to use following his professional sports career.

Enoch the Poet is a well-known author and trauma informed educator. He spoke with students about his pathway to becoming the owner of a publishing company and spoken word artist and facilitator.
