Chromebook Update

With our virtual day and the continued use of 21stcentury technology in the classroom, we know things happen to Chromebooks and get damaged. We are implementing a new protocol for student Chromebook

damage. If students willfully break their first Chromebook at home or school, they will be ineligible for Panther Time for the week. If it occurs a second time, they will be ineligible for Panther Time for the week and will be charged Kickboard dollars; they will be unable to shop at the market and school store. If this occurs a third time, they will be ineligible for panther time for the week, charged kickboard dollars, and loss of school store privileges. The parent/EDM/caregiver must also come to school for a restorative conference.
