RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAM

Our Residential Treatment Program provides 24/7 clinical treatment and trauma-focused care for **youth ages 6 to 14** who have experienced loss, trauma and significant challenges, and whose behaviors are presently too unsafe for them to live in the community.



Our goal is to help them heal and learn new skills so they can live successfully in a home setting. Our skilled and caring staff are dedicated to helping children feel valued and embrace an evidence-based and individualized approach. Each child's family and caregivers are included as full partners in the care and treatment of their children, as possible. Residential services are offered in Plymouth Meeting.

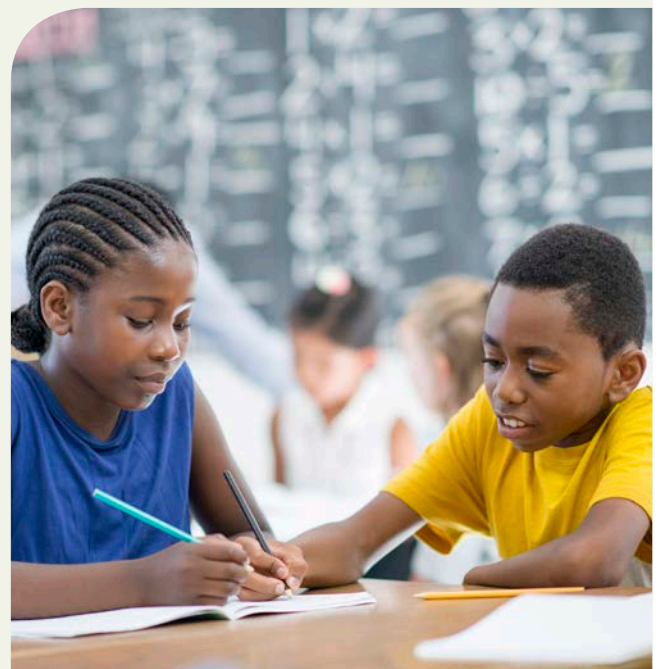

AT **gemma SERVICES**

Martin Luther School (MLS) is an Approved Private School located in Plymouth Meeting that uses a holistic educational approach to assist students in grades K through 12 who need an out-of-district placement with additional support to address learning, emotional, and behavioral challenges.

Martin Luther School has a low student-to-teacher ratio with certified teachers, emotional and behavioral support, 21st century learning opportunities, and related services such as speech and occupational therapy.

We believe in the unlimited potential of each of our students. Central to Martin Luther School is a strong focus on literacy and core academic subject areas. Our school is a Restorative Practices school that promotes healthy relationships and positive discipline inside and outside of school.



ACCOMPANYING PEOPLE OF ALL AGES IN THEIR COMMUNITIES

We provide mental health, child welfare, and prevention services for individuals in their homes, schools, and communities.

Our goal is to help people of all ages feel supported so they can shine.



Community Based Programs Include:

These programs are provided through our Philadelphia locations and, in some cases, via Telehealth.

- **Adoption & Permanency Services** are provided for children and adolescents who have experienced loss, separation, abuse, neglect, and other trauma. These services are for children who have been placed in homes of foster or kinship families because their legal families are unable to care for them at this time.
- **Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)** services are based on the science of learning and behavior and involve the process of implementing basic behavioral interventions to create meaningful behavior changes. ABA services are provided in home and school settings for individuals diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorders. Services include assessments and 1:1 interventions to help them improve their behavioral, social, communication, and adaptive skills.
- **Family Based Mental Health Services (FBMHS)** is an intensive, data-informed, and family-focused approach to support children, adolescents, and their families. Services are provided in their homes and communities. The primary goal of FBMHS is to assist families with maintaining their child in the home and keeping families intact, rather than an out-of-home placement for the child. FBMHS provides intensive individual and family therapy, as well as case management to support a family at home and in the community by a two-person team.
- **Family Empowerment Center (FEC)** is a short-term, voluntary prevention program providing in-home case management, parenting support, and skills-based training for families in Philadelphia. The FEC program connects families with community resources and helps to strengthen and stabilize parents and caregivers who need additional support.
- **Family Support Program (FSP)** is a home-visiting program that is designed to help families with children ages 2–5 years old access additional support. This prevention program partners with parents and caregivers to strengthen their skills and provide the best care for their children.
- **Foster Family Care** includes services for youth from Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia Counties who cannot reside in their own homes presently. The program works with families, county agencies, educators, and others involved in the life of a child, teen, or young adult to identify the best possible home for their unique needs.
- **Intensive Behavioral Health Services (IBHS)** offer intensive support in home and school settings for people up to age 21 experiencing serious emotional or behavioral issues or skill deficits. IBHS programming is designed to give each community member the tools they need to face challenges with a greater sense of strength and resilience and improve overall behavioral functioning.
- **Outpatient Mental Health Services** include individual therapy, family therapy, and medication management for children and teens, ages 2 to 18. Credentialed therapists use evidence-based practices including Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) and Parent Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT). Our team of clinicians is dedicated to the progress and healing of all those we accompany through life's challenges. Services are provided in our Philadelphia locations and via Telehealth.
