Growing a High School

"Martin Luther School wants to unlock the unlimited potential of our students and take their learning beyond the walls of the classroom," explains Declan French, Curriculum Supervisor at Martin Luther School, as he reflects on the school's recent growth. Since the 2021–2022 school year, Martin Luther School (MLS) has added a high school grade each year. Next school year, the first class of 12th graders will graduate from MLS! Every aspect of the School has had to expand to make this vision a reality – from lockers to curriculum to extracurriculars, and more.

After adding several successful areas to the curriculum last year, including Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math (STEAM) classes, this year the curriculum

grew even further. "Family and Consumer Science is new this year," French said. "It is applicable to the real world with hands-on experience for students," he explained of the newest elective available to middle and high school students. German was also added, with plans for additional language options in the future.

The high school operates on a semester-based schedule that incorporates interdisciplinary projects. "Semester-based courses allow our students to think across the curriculum and consider how their learning applies to their broader lives," says French. Each semester culminates with an end-of-semester presentation during which the MLS community has the chance to celebrate our high schoolers.

The school's Student Council provides leadership opportunities, too. "The students feel proud of the positions they hold," says Siobhan Canavan, Supervisor of Pupil Personnel Services. At each meeting, the Student Council brings forth ideas for improving the student experience. "As their suggestions are implemented, they will certainly see how they are making a difference for the whole school."

At MLS, students have many opportunities to achieve their unlimited potential every day. As one student recently asked his peers during his end-of-semester presentation, "How are you going to change the world and make it better?" MLS is providing pathways for every student to do just that.

Because Every Athlete Matters

Many evenings this winter, the gym on our Plymouth Meeting campus was filled with students, staff members, and families cheering on the basketball team during Martin Luther School's inaugural season of interscholastic sports.

Now a member of the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA), this school year finds Martin Luther School (MLS) students competing against other local schools in flag football, basketball, and track, with a cheerleading squad this winter, too. "It was important to me to join the PIAA," explains Donte Golson-Goodman, the school's first Athletic Director. "Joining this league allows students to participate in sports on a broader scale. Being a member of a sports team helps teach life skills like handling adversity, good communication, and practicing respect while offering students opportunities for success and life-long sports involvement."

Expanding the athletics program is part of a broader vision of growing Martin Luther School's offerings for its students. "Our school's athletic program is about creating a fantastic high school experience," says Eva Morrison, Head of Martin Luther School and Vice President of Education. "We want our students to shine in the classroom and on the field. That's why we provide a variety of opportunities for them to represent our school in the PIAA."

"We are thrilled that our Family Support Program is expanding to Delaware County," shared Valerie

Colquitt Wright, Senior Director of Prevention Programs. "In the first year, we expect to accompany more than 50 families in Delco." Families can access the program through referrals from other providers such as Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Elwyn, or self-refer.

The evening will include a delicious meal designed and presented by Chef Rucker, fun auctions, and an inspiring program about the youth and families of Gemma Services. We asked Chef Rucker about what inspires his culinary approach and shared his response below. We hope to see you at *Chefs*!

What is your favorite thing about cooking in Philadelphia? Without a doubt it's the products that are available and the incredibly hard-working people who provide them. Being able to connect our guests to a specific farm or ranch is rewarding & really helps tell the story.

What is your favorite thing to eat in Philadelphia? Naturally the pizza & hoagie game is super strong here, but I really love water ice when it's in season.

You have said you don't like to repeat menu items. Why? River Twice is constantly evolving. The cuisine is based on what Mother Nature provides. She is in way more control of my menu than I am, and it's our #1 job not to mess it up. Much of our cuisine is also based on our larder, which is made of many different items that are constantly changing as they age and take on new flavors and roles.

What location has had the biggest influence on your culinary style? My heritage and growing up on the Gulf Coast is the easiest answer to that question. There is a certain boldness and warmth to my food that I feel is very southern.

Do you have a favorite cooking or meal prep "hack" to share? Learn the true capabilities of your microwave. It is truly an amazing tool!

What is an underrated ingredient that you love to use? I don't know if it's a certain ingredient, but I think most folks don't understand the importance of acid when cooking. Vinegar is a great place to start!

What excites you about being the featured guest chef at Chefs for Gemma 2024? It's an honor to be part of such an event for a couple of reasons. The first is knowing the lineage of great chefs who have participated in previous years, but what excites me the most is knowing it is supporting such an incredible cause. I'm grateful to be a part of something that touches so many people's lives.
